MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The investment objective of the Fund is to generate a relatively high level of total investment return by investing primarily in bonds of Canadian governments and companies. The investments of the Fund are primarily bonds of Canadian governments and companies which do not mature for at least one year and with a rating not lower than BBB by an approved credit rating agency. The Fund may also invest in bonds or other debt instruments which are issued by foreign issuers. The Fund invests primarily in securities of companies that conduct themselves in a responsible manner. The average term to maturity of the Fund's portfolio is typically five to twelve years.

Risk

There were no significant changes that affected the Fund's overall level of risk during the reporting period. The risks of investing in the Fund and the suitability of the Fund for investors remain as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus.

The Manager previously adopted the risk classification methodology under National Instrument 81-102 – *Investment Funds* (the "new risk classification methodology"). The Manager reviews each fund's risk rating on an annual basis or if there has been a material change to a fund's investment objectives or investment strategies. Any changes to a fund's risk rating are the result of the Manager's annual review and the adoption of the risk classification methodology. The risk classification for this Fund has not changed.

There were no changes to the Fund's risk rating during the reporting period.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value fell to \$158 million as of December 31, 2021, from \$168 million at the end of 2020. The decrease in net assets was attributable to a decrease from operations of \$6.0 million and net redemptions of \$3.4 million.

Over the past year, the Fund's Series A units lost 3.5%. The benchmark lost 2.5%. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while the benchmark return does not include any costs of investing. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for the returns of any other series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

The Canadian yield curve flattened aggressively during the fourth quarter as 5-year yields rose 14 basis points (bps) while 30-year rates fell 31 bps. Government of Canada one-year yields rose the most during the quarter, closing the year 49 basis points higher than at the end of September. The U.S. Federal Reserve announced an accelerated tapering of its bond purchase program, responding

to strong employment and inflation data. Provincial and Corporate spreads narrowed, driven by strong demand and positive equity market returns. A longer duration bias and curve positioning helped relative performance in the fourth quarter as longer rates declined. The Canada sector allocation benefited the most from curve positioning due to an overweight in longer maturities. The allocation to corporate Financial bonds was a drag on performance due to the shorter maturity bias.

Recent Developments

Economic growth continues to be supported by fiscal stimulus and a historically high saving rate. In addition, the unemployment rate should see a decline as pandemic related closures re-open. Inflation will experience cyclical pressure due to the base effects as measures reflect the rebound from the depths of the pandemic lockdown period. Potential risks to our base case include: higher personal and corporate taxes due to the significant U.S. fiscal stimulus; and inflation being higher than expected due to supportive monetary and fiscal policy which could result in driving longer term interest rates higher. Going forward, portfolio duration will continue to be actively managed to take advantage of interest rate volatility.

Related-Party Transactions

Portfolio Manager, Registrar and Fund Accounting Agent

Encasa Financial Inc. is the Portfolio Manager of the Fund. Encasa has appointed Addenda Capital Inc. as portfolio sub-adviser in respect of the Encasa Canadian Bond Fund. National Bank Financial Inc. is the registrar and fund accounting agent of the Fund. The Fees paid to Addenda Capital Inc. and National Bank Financial Inc. are paid by the Manager and not the Fund.

Distributor

Worldsource Financial Management Inc. is the principal distributor of the Fund. The fees paid to Worldsource Financial Management Inc. are paid by the Manager and not the Fund.

Trustee and Custodian

Natcan Trust Company is the trustee and custodian of the Fund. Natcan Trust Company holds title to the Fund's property on behalf of unitholders and also holds the assets of the Fund. The fees paid to Natcan Trust Company are paid by the Manager and not the Fund.

¹ The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. The Manager may, at its discretion and without notice to unitholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by the Manager of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by the Manager.

² The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

³ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The trading expense ratio is not applicable to fixed-income transactions.

Management Fees

Encasa Financial Inc. is the Manager of the Fund. Management fees for each series of the Fund are calculated at the annual percentages, before taxes, of the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund. 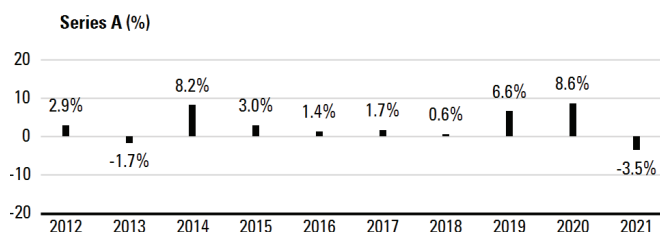
