MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION OF FUND PERFORMANCE

Investment Objective and Strategies

The investment objective of the Fund is to obtain a relatively high level of current interest income consistent with preserving capital and maintaining liquidity by investing primarily in Canadian short-term debt instruments using a responsible investment approach. The Fund invests primarily in high-quality debt obligations issued or guaranteed by Canadian governments and companies that conduct themselves in a responsible manner. The average term to maturity of the Fund's portfolio is typically one to five years.

Risk

There were no significant changes that affected the Fund's overall level of risk during the reporting year. The risks of investing in the Fund and the suitability of the Fund for investors remain as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus.

The Manager previously adopted the risk classification methodology under National Instrument 81-102 – *Investment Funds* (the "new risk classification methodology"). The Manager reviews each fund's risk rating on an annual basis or if there has been a material change to a fund's investment objectives or investment strategies. Any changes to a fund's risk rating are the result of the Manager's annual review and the adoption of the risk classification methodology. The risk classification for this Fund has not changed.

There were no changes to the Fund's risk rating during the reporting year.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net asset value fell to \$241.2 million as of December 31, 2022, from \$258.6 million at the end of 2021. The decrease in net assets was attributable to a decrease from operations of \$13.0 million and net redemptions of \$4.4 million.

Over the past year, the Fund's Series A units lost 5.0%. The benchmark lost 4.0%. The Fund's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, while the benchmark return does not include any costs of investing. See the Financial Highlights section for the management expense ratios and the Past Performance section for information on returns.

The Bank of Canada slowed its pace of monetary policy tightening during the fourth quarter, raising the overnight target rate by 100 basis points (bps) to 4.25%. Similarly, the Federal Reserve tightened by a total of 125 bps, to finish the year at a target range of 4.25% – 4.50%. Both central banks suggested that they have not completed their tightening for this cycle. During most of the year, rates rose across the curve even as the Bank of Canada signaled a slower pace of tightening and inflation data continued moving lower. Short term rates

rose more than longer term rates. Corporate spreads narrowed during the quarter after hitting the widest levels of the year in October. Curve positioning was positive with the underweight in the 0- to 3-year part of the curve where bond yields rose the most. The allocation to defensive Canadian holdings hurt performance as spreads narrowed in the quarter.

Recent Developments

Unemployment remains stable as tight labour markets create supportive conditions. Economic growth is expected to slow down in 2023 but should remain positive as domestic demand is supported by strong labour market dynamics and excess household savings. Unemployment has been slow to adjust due to tight labour markets. Recession risk increases as the year progresses due to the maintenance of restrictive monetary policy. Central banks have begun to "step down" the pace of monetary policy tightening at the end of 2022. Some further tightening is expected in 2023 and they will reach the terminal level for this cycle and pause to assess the impact. Against the backdrop of slowing economic growth, but higher than target inflation, central banks will focus on price stability and will not pivot to stimulate growth in the near term. Expect continued steady planned reductions in balance sheet holdings which will reduce liquidity and support for risk assets. Inflation pressure should continue to moderate throughout 2023 but will remain above central bank targets in terms of both level and scope. Service inflation is persistent, while goods inflation declines. Dislocations in the labour markets with more job openings than available workers continue to put pressure on wages. Uncertainty related to slowing economic momentum and determined central banks will contribute to market volatility. Despite a declining trend, consumer price inflation proves more persistent causing central banks to maintain tighter policy conditions for longer. Higher interest rates and higher inflation cause more significant demand destruction and a deeper recession.

Related-Party Transactions

Portfolio Manager, Registrar and Fund Accounting Agent

Encasa Financial Inc. acts as the Manager and the Portfolio Manager of the Fund and earns fees from the Fund for such services. Encasa has appointed Addenda Capital Inc. as portfolio sub-adviser in respect of the Encasa Canadian Short-Term Bond Fund. National Bank Financial Inc. through its National Bank Independent Network division has been appointed as registrar and fund accounting agent of the Fund. The Fees paid to Addenda Capital Inc. and National Bank Financial Inc. are paid by the Manager and not the Fund.

Distributor

Worldsource Financial Management Inc. is the principal distributor of the Fund. The fees paid to Worldsource Financial Management Inc. are paid by the Manager and not the Fund.

Trustee and Custodian

Natcan Trust Company is the trustee and custodian of the Fund. Natcan Trust Company holds title to the Fund's property on behalf of unitholders and also holds the assets of the Fund. The fees paid to Natcan Trust Company are paid by the Manager and not the Fund.

¹ The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses for the stated period, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average net asset value during the period. The Manager may, at its discretion and without notice to unitholders, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by the Manager of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by the Manager.

² The Fund's portfolio turnover rate gives an indication of the level of activity employed by the portfolio manager. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

³ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. The trading expense ratio is not applicable to fixed-income transactions.

Management Fees

Encasa Financial Inc. is the Manager of the Fund. Management fees for each series of the Fund are calculated at the annual percentages, before taxes, of the daily net asset value of each series of the Fund. 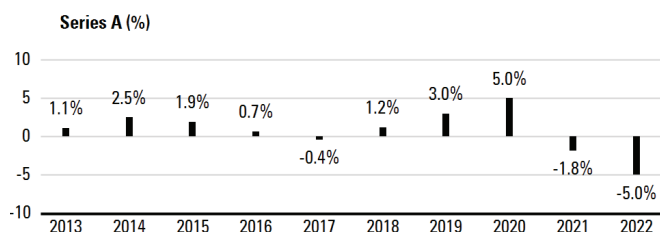
